



## **Brad Call 2013-14 NACS Chairman**

Brad Call is a member of Maverik Inc.'s Board of Directors and serves the Salt Lake City, Utah-based company as vice president of adventure culture, which includes human resources, leadership development and recruiting, public relations and marketing.

In 1928, 20-year-old Reuel Call opened a two-pump gas station in Afton, Wyoming, with money he earned from renting roller skates. Today, with more than 250 stores in 10 western states, Maverik is the largest independent chain of convenience stores in the inter-mountain west.

Prior to joining Maverik full time in 1998, Call was employed as corporate counsel and director of congressional affairs for Fluor Corporation in Washington, D.C. Call also served as the NACS treasurer and vice chairman of government relations before being named chairman at the 2013 NACS Show in Atlanta. He previously served on the NACS/Coca-Cola Retailing Research Council and is a 5-Star NACSPAC member.

Call is a member of the Board of Directors of Beehive Bank and the host of a weekly travel show on Utah's number-one rated radio station, KSL. He earned a B.S in accounting in 1990 from Brigham Young University and a J.D. in 1993 from the George Washington School of Law; Call served as Republican president at both institutions.
